The following items are required to complete your application.

- Completed application form
- \$60 application fee
- Professional resume or curriculum vitae
- Essays as described in the application
- Current Credential Assembly Service (LSDAS) file from LSAC
- Two letters of recommendation – one must be from a law school professor
- Law school letter of good standing
- Law school transcript with fall and spring semester grades
- Law school class rank for the first year

Applicants are encouraged to be as forthright and open as possible, and should feel free to discuss unusual circumstances or situations of adversity that may have influenced their current values. Be aware that both the quality of your writing and the thoughtfulness of your answers will be evaluated.

1. Describe the goals that are motivating you to pursue a law degree. How do you think the skills and experience you will gain at Vermont Law School will help you achieve those goals?
2. How have you tried to effect change in relation to an issue of personal, local, or national significance?
3. Optional Question: Give a realistic appraisal of your academic work since graduation from high school. Please note any inconsistencies in your record and the reasons for them.

Professional Resumé

Please enclose or attach a copy of your professional resume' showing your employment history since graduation from high school. If your education since high school graduation was interrupted from one semester or more, be sure to account for that period of time. In addition, please include awards, and extracurricular and personal activities.

Law School Writing Sample

All transfer applicants are required to submit a copy of a law school writing sample.

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Character and Fitness
