**Library Access and Use Policy:  
Federal Depository Library Program**

The Julien and Virginia Cornell Law Library is a private law library serving the research and educational needs of the Vermont Law School community.

The Cornell Library is a selective depository as part of the Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP.) Through the FDLP, the public may access depository materials in print, microfiche and electronic format free of charge.

Depository access is available when permanent library staff members are on duty. All depository users must check in at the Library Information Desk and show a valid ID. Library staff will then be available to assist users with accessing depository materials. Depository users do not have borrowing privileges. Use of the FDLP materials does not include full access to Cornell Library collections and services.

We reserve the right to request identification to verify status of all users. We reserve the right to restrict access to non-VLS users during exam periods, times of increased library demand by the VLS community, and for other reasons as required.

**The Cornell Library reserves the right to deny library privileges, including access, to any patron who, for example:**

- Fails to show appropriate identification when requested.
- Fails to show a demonstrated need to use law library materials.
- Fails to respect the rights of other patrons.
- Fails to respect library property.
- Fails to follow the library's written policies and rules set forth in library publications.

This policy is not intended to replace any existing VLS campus wide policies.
