NOTE: Most of the material in Chapters 1-2 readings reinforce concepts and skills introduced in Legal Writing I and applied in your first semester doctrinal courses (e.g. weight of authority, sources of law, judicial system hierarchy, case briefing) to help you build your proficiency, glean a different perspective on materials covered, and self-reflect on your competency with the foundational knowledge expected for Legal Writing II.
