Students: Come to the first class with a written description to hand in, of the environmental legal topic you intend to research *and* your intended audience for the memo. See *Research Memo Expectations* on the course TWEN site for details. Choose a topic focused on U.S. environmental law, federal and/or state.

Pre-Class Assignments:

It is essential that pre-class work be done before each class.

In-class work will build on pre-class work, and students will be expected to explain how they the explored the resources, **and present the resources they have selected for their Research Memos.**

Pre-class Reading and Assignments and applying what you've learned to your Research Memo:

- Thoroughly read the Research Memo instructions on the TWEN site. Determine a title for your Memo, the intended audience/recipient(s) of your Memo, and also write a description (one paragraph minimum to one page maximum) of your Research Memo topic. Choose a U.S. federal and /or state topic. You can add an international perspective, if you wish, but the focus must be on U.S. environmental law. **Print out a paper copy of this description and bring it with you to turn in during the first class.**

- Do an Advanced Search in Julien for something related to your Research Memo topic. Consider limiting your search results to material type: ebook. Browse your search results.

Explore. For identifying relevant books, it is almost unbeatable. It lists nearby (mostly academic) libraries that own the books. It also indexes additional resources, and often links to full-text material.
