LITIGATING TAKINGS CHALLENGES TO LAND USE AND ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATIONS

This conference explores the takings issue as it relates to land use and environmental rules and other forms of regulation. In addition to offering a basic education in modern takings law, the conference brings together a diverse group of leading scholars and experienced practitioners to discuss cutting-edge issues. The conference will address the MRGO takings ruling by Judge Susan Braden of the U.S. Court of Federal Claims, the pending U.S. Supreme Court case of *Murr v. State of Wisconsin* dealing with the “parcel as whole” issue, and recent challenges to the Williamson County takings exhaustion doctrine. Other topics to be addressed include potential impacts on property owners of coastal retreat policies adopted in response to sea level rise due to climate change and the takings legacy of the late Justice Antonin Scalia.

Former Solicitor of the U.S. Department of Interior John Leshy will deliver a keynote talk addressing recent legal challenges to the legitimacy of the United States’ legal title to one-third of the nation’s land.

KEY QUESTIONS TO BE ADDRESSED

- What are the implications of the MRGO takings ruling?
- How will the Supreme Court resolve the parcel issue in *Murr v. State of Wisconsin*?
- Is the Williamson County exhaustion doctrine alive and well – or not?
- How will coastal retreat in the face of climate change affect private property?
- Can the government take private property by regulating too little?
- When does government-caused flooding amount to a taking?
- Does the U.S. government have legitimate title to federal public lands?
- What is the takings legacy of the late Justice Antonin Scalia?
