

General Practice Program (“GPP”) Certificate Learning Outcomes

Upon satisfactory completion of this specialized Certificate, students should be able to:

Legal Literacy: Analyze fundamental U.S. law particularly in areas commonly associated with solo, small, or general practice law firms, including but not limited to real estate, criminal law, taxation, family law, bankruptcy, commercial transactions, and/or estate planning (“General Practice law.”).

Problem Solving: Apply legal practice skills to “real world” scenarios commonly encountered in General Practice law.

Independent Learning Capacity: Demonstrate self-awareness to identify gaps in knowledge, skills, values, and other competencies commonly encountered in General Practice law and to engage in continuing and lifelong learning opportunities to maintain or attain proficiency.

Professionalism: Demonstrate ethics and professionalism within and across diverse groups of people and clients with varying backgrounds and perspectives (e.g. cultural, socio-economic, racial, age, special needs) commonly encountered in General Practice law.
