



JD/MASTER'S DUAL DEGREE CLIMATE AND ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

Earn a JD degree from Northeastern University School of Law and an MCEP degree from Vermont Law and Graduate School in 3 years. Combine the litigation and advocacy skills of a JD with the specialized environmental courses and policy skills of the MCEP.

The MCEP combines a summer in Vermont taking short, intense courses on cutting-edge topics in environmental law and policy, and online, asynchronous policy skills courses. Our campus in rural Vermont is on the banks of the White River, with plenty of recreational opportunities outside of class. Students may also complete the entire MCEP degree online.

The JD/Master of Climate and Environmental Policy (MCEP) dual degree offers benefits for Northeastern students including a streamlined MCEP application process and tuition savings.

Dual degree students may count 12 MCEP credits toward the JD degree and 12 JD credits toward the MCEP degree for tuition savings for both degrees.
